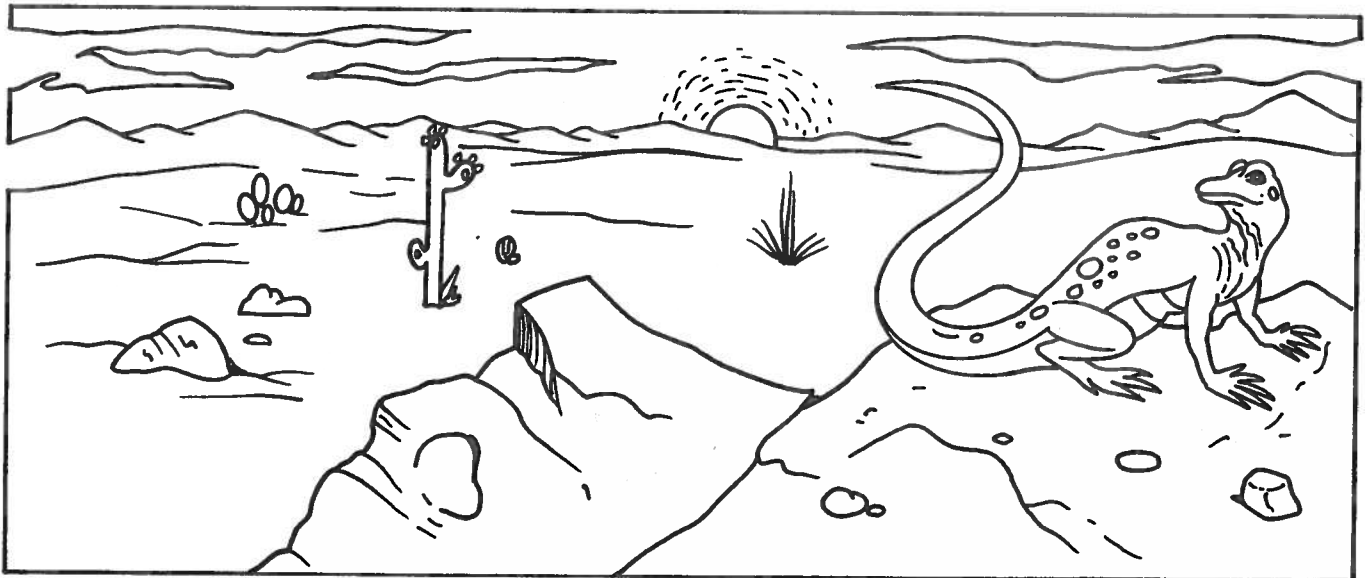

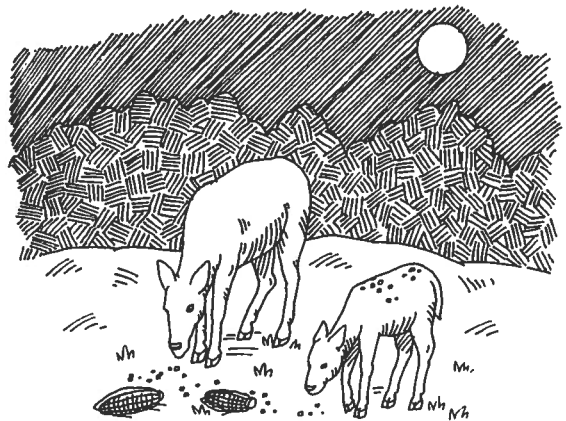
"A doe and her fawn are in the woods by the house," Aunt Jean told them. "Maybe they will come out to see you while you are here."

"That's what everyone says," thought the girl. She returned to her work, and went to bed that night cold and hungry.

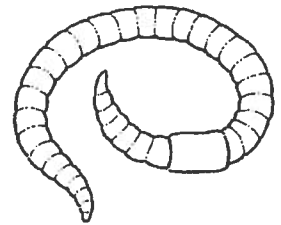
